Workshops

Prevention with High Risk Families

The multidisciplinary team in this workshop will focus on working with high risk families. Discussion will be on strategies for intervention with the emphasis on prevention programming.

Is It Child Abuse? Interviewing Families

A multidisciplinary presentation about interviewing parents and children in the medical setting. Interview guidelines and practical approaches for doctors, nurses, and social workers will be demonstrated by films and discussions.

How to Give Expert Testimony

This workshop will focus on preparing the health care professional for giving effective testimony in court. Videotapes and discussions will be used for demonstrations.

Evaluation of Child Sexual Abuse

This workshop will cover a multidisciplinary assessment of child sexual abuse. This includes medical diagnosis, evidence to be gathered, and information to be obtained from the child and significant others. Specific interview techniques will be discussed.

Evaluation of the Burned/Abused Child

The evaluation and differentiation between accidental burn injuries and child abuse will be the focus of this workshop. Implications for immediate and long term treatment will be discussed. This workshop will only be held on Tuesday at 3:10 p.m.

Working with Families of Failure to Thrive Patients

This workshop will focus on the psychosocial evaluations of families of children diagnosed as nonorganic failure to thrive. Intervention strategies for immediate and long term management will be discussed.

The Towsley Center

The Towsley Center for Continuing Medical Education is one of the few modern conference centers in the country devoted entirely to health education. It is also one of the premier conference facilities of any kind. Among its resources are the 485-seat Dow Auditorium, the 144-seat Sheldon Lecture Room, 3 classrooms of 45-60 seats each, 3 conference rooms for 20 each, full dining facilities, and an expansive display lobby. Soon to be added is a medical bookstore. Full audiovisual capabilities are maintained, including such features as audio and video recording, closed-circuit television, video projection of a 12-foot image, and interactive teaching computers. An associated unit is the Learning Resource Center, which has 100 study carrels, 3 educational computer rooms, and 2 clinical skills rooms.

By legislative mandate, the Office of Continuing Medical Education is self-supporting, including all conference-related costs of the Towsley Center.
