Program Content and Objectives

In 1975 the passage of the Michigan Child Protection Law was a milestone in the development of an awareness of child abuse in this state. But, a decade has passed and we need to take a look at what we've accomplished, what needs to be done, and what issues await us.

The 1986 Michigan Conference addresses a range of issues related to adequate care of our youth. Issues like the extent and consequences of teenage pregnancy, infant mortality, sexual offenses committed by adolescents, and emotional abuse are presented, along with new perspectives on parenting education and failure to thrive.

We have planned a conference that is meant for a broad range of people interested in the problem of child abuse. Our objective is to provide participants with up to date information to aid them in developing new perspectives and strategies for dealing with the problems they face.

It has been over five years since professionals working on all the varying aspects of child abuse in Michigan have had an opportunity to meet together. We hope that you benefit not only from the information shared by conference speakers but also from sharing your own experiences with fellow participants.
