## **Program Content and Objectives**

Some care providers believe the key to solving the problem of child abuse and neglect lies in prevention. Those same care providers are faced with the reality of responding to the demands of already existing cases of child abuse and neglect, with little time or resources to devote to prevention. Thus, they are increasingly isolated by conflicting demands. For seven years, the Michigan Statewide Conference on Child Abuse and Neglect has been bringing professionals together to share up-to-the-minute information and to provide a forum for exchange of knowledge in this challenging field.

This year the conference addresses a range of issues on subjects from prevention of child abuse to assessment, intervention, and treatment. Issues such as emotional abuse, Failure to Thrive, new parenting programs, adolescent sexual offenders, sexual abuse of people with developmental disabilities, and the Family Preservation Act will be discussed. Of particular note is the prevention track offered on day one for those participants wishing to focus on the prevention of child abuse.

We have planned a conference that is meant for a broad range of people interested in the problem of child abuse. Our objective is to offer participants state of the art information to aid them in developing new perspectives and strategies for dealing with the problems they face.

We hope that you will benefit not only from the information shared by conference speakers but also from sharing your own experiences with your colleagues.
